# PRESIDENT SMITH

Churchwide we are beginning to enter a great new era of missionary work. It should be both exciting and motivating to all missionaries who will further strengthen the Lord's Kingdom through the guidance and inspiration of His Holy Spirit. As a Church, we have experienced rapid growth throughout the world, Great Britain being no exception.



With the help of the Lord, we will enter this new era where every missionary, finding and teaching by the Spirit and cooperating with the members of the Church, we'll find many future leaders in this England East Mission. Leaders in the Church are priesthood holders, many of them are fathers and heads of families.

President Tuttle on a recent visit made the statement that one of the greatest fears we experience in the field of missionary work is "the fear of men". In our effort to attract potential priesthood holders to the Church, it is obvious that we as missionaries and representatives of Jesus Christ must stand profoundly and fearlessly in carrying the great message of the restoration.

Remember always "For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Jesus Christ: for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth; to the Jew first, and also to the Greek." --Romans 1:16--

The Church will be mightily strengthened by the addition of priesthood power. For instance, in a family set, if the father is converted, chances are extremely good that his wife and children will also be converted. There will be greater potential for family unity, financial support of Church programs, temple marriage, etc., than if a wife or single children and other individuals are converted without first involving the potential priesthood holders in the family. Individuals outside the family context will be taught as they are exposed to the Church and express an interest, but whereever a tie can first be made with the father or head of the family, it should be done. In the event he did not join at least his good will and high opinion of the Church should follow. Where the wife joins the Church before the husband, the chance of her husband being converted are not too bright and in these instances, some of the children join the Church and some do not. These situations occasionally produce lack of harmony in a home.

Recently Sister Smith and I, and President and Sister Cliff Johnson (President Johnson being one of the new missionary representatives) held two very successful seminars in the mission, which in total nearly half of the mission force had opportunity to bear their testimonies and cite faith promoting experiences. Later, President and Sister Theodore Tuttle stayed with us for two days during which time President Tuttle shared with the Assistants some of the new techniques and ideas which he had previously demonstrated to the British mission presidents and their wives at our seminar in Bristol on October 31 and November 1. He underscored again the fact that the new discussions will be eight in number and will be shorter than the present discussions. In fact, with guidelines for responding to both negative and affirmative answers in our contacts, the total words in the eight new discussions will be no greater in

number than the present six. Also, there will be more latitude for speaking and bearing witness as directed by the Spirit.

Elder and Sister Thomas S. Monson were in London over the past weekend and it was the privilege of Sister Smith and I and the missionaries laboring in the area of the London and London North Stakes to hear Elder Monson of the Council of the Twelve and former mission president and his gracious wife give great emphasis to missionary work and the correlation program as it relates to missionary work. At the general sessions of the two conferences, six missionaries as well as your mission president and his wife also had the opportunity to speak and bear testimony as to the joy of missionary work.

At this time of Thanksgiving we feel very blessed to be able to serve with you in such a noble cause. With our goal of converting and helping fellowship families, we will be more truly servants of our Father in Heaven and our reward will be that great inner peace past all understanding.

You are an outstanding missionary force. At the moment of this writing, 201 in number. So that each of you may be acquainted with the location of your fellow missionaries they are, as of the evening of November 22, located as contained in the pages to follow.

The above includes the 51 missionaries who have arrived in the England East Mission since Sister Smith and I reached London on July 7, 1972. These fine missionaries have joined the already splendid force to give this great mission an unlimited potential. During this period since July 7, 43 have departed for their homes. No other releases are scheduled before early February 1f 1973. We anticipate more new arrivals prior to that time. With such a wonderful group, we can and will, by seeking the Spirit, build the Kingdom of God through our missionary labors and will do it with Enthusiasm, Excellence, and Motivation. We must do our work in the true correlation manner which is outlined in your new mission handbook, which we hope you are studying. New techniques and tools and helps will unfold during the weeks and months ahead.

Once again, we call to your attention the ultimate motivator—the following great promise of our Heavenly Father through the Prophet Joseph Smith:

"Hearken, 0 ye who have given your names to go forth to proclaim my gospel, and to prune my vineyard.

Behold, I say unto you that it is my will that you should go forth and not tarry, neither be idle but labor with your might--


